YOUR SCHOOL'S APPROACH

What approach are you using with your students? Is it working? Does it work equally well with each of them? Thirty years ago, we didn't even know to ask these questions, so don't feel bad if you haven't given them serious thought, either. But by the grace of God, something happened that caused us to ask questions about the education of our children. Maybe your reading this is an act of Providence in the life of your school.

THE OPPORTUNITY OF A LIFETIME

Doesn't it seem there ought to be an ideal way for children to learn? This was a nagging thought for us, but we had no answers. That is, until we learned of *classical education from a Christian worldview*. The idea of an education that taught children in a way that was in line with how God made children to learn was very attractive. What's more, this method is rigorous and has a long history of proven results.

Classical education takes a three-fold approach. This *trivium*, which it is frequently called, is Latin for "three roads" and lays out three stages of learning: grammar, dialectic (or logic), and rhetoric. The genius of classical education—why it works so well—is because it teaches "with the grain" of how children develop. When they're young, they enjoy memorizing and learning lots of things. The junior high years find them interested in challenging, arguing, and wanting to understand how things relate to each other. During the senior high years, they become more concerned with how they are perceived, wanting to be articulate and persuasive in winsome ways. Teaching according to their God-given tendencies proves to be remarkably effective, not to mention that it trains children to learn for themselves—as life-long learners.

Classical education from Veritas intends to be academically rigorous, distinctively Christian, and methodologically aligned with how God made us to learn.





The Veritas Approach to Art

Young children are almost without exception "drawn" to art (pun intended)! Their innate curiosity and wonder about the entire creation naturally extends to wanting to capture it in vivid colors on paper. So a formal, comprehensive art program is essential to a classical education from a Christian worldview. Introducing children to the visual arts and training them how to capture beauty addresses the third part of the invaluable trivium of Truth, Goodness, and Beauty.

Done properly, a classical art course uses the Godgiven way children learn and acquire skills (mostly through imitation), and thereby come to create and appreciate beauty. In keeping with Veritas' commitment to and use of students' characteristics at each stage of growth, in our art program we apply the following approach:

GRAMMAR (K-6th grades):

During the earliest years we use sensory exploration and their natural interest in the world's variety: colors, smells, light, sounds, textures, even tastes build strong associations in a child's mind. Wonderful book illustrations can be appreciated very early on.

This is a time to guide their exploration of art media, giving them simple objects and scenes to see and copy frequently. Imitation is their God-given way of approaching the adult world. At this level the classical methods we use reinforce and encourage the imitative nature of children.

The primary tool we use, *Drawing With Children* (by Mona Brooks), presents copying and practice as a means of learning to draw. It insists on developing mastery of basics, focusing on five basic elements an "alphabet" of shapes: dots, the circle family, the straight line family, the angle line family, and the curved line family.

Extensive practice is key. Even the great Michelangelo said, "If people knew how hard I worked to get my mastery, it wouldn't seem so wonderful at all." Unlike some contemporary thought, we recognize great value in the mastery of basics. It's the "grammar" of art.

Students learn to view the world through these five shapes and how to develop the images on paper. All can learn to become artists to the extent God has gifted them and develop their own unique style of realistic interpretation. And to the extraordinarily gifted, this training in the basics will always serve them well.

As the children mature, we help them attain closer and clearer reproductions in their own work and also increasingly expose them to the names and works of famous masters—learning to recognize similarity (style) of pieces and naming them.

SECONDARY (7th-12th grades):

Maturing children want to "get it right" in art. They want to present their best in the junior high years, so we introduce and practice more precise techniques. They discover the capabilities of various tools and get many opportunities to practice the right ways to use them. They like knowing the "secrets" of making the tools work well. They learn to apply the basic "elements of art," e.g., line, shape, texture, balance, etc. in more complex ways than they did when younger. They like being able to produce a certain look, practicing with various objects, differing techniques, and color experimentation. We link recognition of beauty with an appreciation for creation. This is an appropriate time to address clear, biblical principles (e.g., Phil. 4:8) for evaluating art works (old and new), and ask questions related to the meaning and worth of an artistic message, techniques/skills displayed, etc. (see the chart on previous page).

Simply put, creation is our best model for what God considers beautiful and fitting for imitation and meditation. This doesn't limit a student's scope—just the opposite. Creation, including man's shaping and use of it (as seen in historical events, architecture, landscapes, everyday life), provides us with an almost inexhaustible source of subjects. Principles in God's Word guide our study of art history, which includes the examination of the best works of artists in the past (most of them non-Christians). We "plunder the Egyptians" and recognize that, self-consciously or not, these artists gave glory to God through beautifully reflecting His light, color, balance, atmosphere, and other true and accurate displays of His character in the work of the creation.

Systematic, encouraging exposure to God-honoring use of creative skills calls to the heart and mind of a child: seeing and appreciating with the heart, understanding and emulating with the mind (eye and hand). Creatively using trained skills to portray a unique vision is the appropriate work of an artist. Glory to God, not oneself, should be the primary goal of all Christian artists. This conviction, combined with skill and the love of real beauty, will set Christian students and artists on a path that will restore great art. It will even win over the relativistic, humanistic view of art today.



History of Art: Creation to Contemporary is a distinctively Christian overview covering well-known works of art as well as art by Christians and about the Christian faith. This art history curriculum was designed to be flexible in order to add *beauty* not *burden* to your students' learning experience. There are at least four ways to use this art history curriculum:

OPTION ONE

Two great works of art are on each of the 32 flashcards, along with information about each art movement studied. The full-color workbook contains comprehension questions, crafts, activities, readings, and features on artists of the faith.

OPTION TWO

Fully integrated with the Veritas History Series (yet able to stand on its own), this art history program can extend from second grade to sixth, to enjoy several cards at a time.

OPTION THREE

The versatility of this curriculum makes it possible to consider using it as a transitional program in seventh grade, because it spans all of Western history. Although full of fun activities for youngerkids, the textbook also has in-depth readings for older students.

OPTION FOUR

Finally, the art history cards could be used to complement an art program where students are learning to "do" art that you may already be using, mixing them in as a way to add "appreciating" art, its depth and inspiration, while developing basic art skills. Your student will be able to identify all the major art movements in Western art as well as know the titles and artists responsible for over five dozen artistic masterpieces. These movements and works of art are the grammar of art history and will allow the student to navigate nearly every museum of Western art in the world, as well as know

how they fit in the study of history.

The Veritas Approach to Bible

How important is it that your children are biblically literate?

The most important thing to teach a child, the Bible, is often the most neglected. We know this from more than 20 years of data. Parents think that children will learn the Bible at church or from hearing it read on occasion. Family devotions and prayer time are good things, but children need more. Children must learn the biblical narrative. They need to know what is where in the Bible. They should know when biblical events happened, too. It should be second nature to them.

How well do your children know the stories of Noah, Nehemiah, Esther, Jacob, Paul, and Peter? Do they know them better than Mickey Mouse or SpongeBob SquarePants? Can they name the Twelve Tribes of Israel? Veritas Bible students can. Imagine a 7-year-old rattling off the Twelve Tribes as easily as naming the four Gospels. When was the Exodus? When did Solomon live? The importance of knowing the biblical stories and when they happened can't be overstated.

When we started our venture in classical education in 1992, we did it to raise the bar of K–12 education. We did it for our children and for yours. We now have another, more focused concern—biblical illiteracy in Christian families.

The development of our first project, the grammar school history program, was followed by our Bible curriculum. We didn't want children to see the events of Scripture isolated from history. We wanted knowledge of history and knowledge of the Bible

to be integrated. When reading the story of Joseph, students should know that he lived just prior to the Hyksos' invasion of Egypt. When reading about Jesus' early life, students should understand the Roman world into which He was born.

The Veritas Bible program integrates with the first two series of Veritas History: Old Testament and Ancient Egypt and New Testament, Greece, and Rome. Children can see how the various timelines fit together. Like Veritas History, Veritas Bible is a five-year program, grades 2–6. Each year covers 32 events, 160 events in all.

In the grammar stage, we help children memorize all this information so they can access it throughout their lives. For each of the 160 events, they memorize a date and a Scripture reference so they can find it in the Bible. Memorization isn't enough, though. We want to bring the word to life so that children embrace what they are learning. God uses stories to tell us about our history and the world He created. We do the same thing in our Bible program.

Before beginning Veritas Bible's five-year program, children go through two biblical surveys: the Old Testament in Kindergarten and the New Testament in 1st grade. This abbreviated telling of the story of God's word is perfect for their age and prepares them for the depth of study to follow.

The Veritas Approach to Grammar, Writing and Composition

No one disputes the need for children to learn to read and write. They're two of the three Rs. But mastering grammar and writing exceptionally has fewer devotees. We're guessing that's because it's hard to clearly define and even harder to produce in our students. Yet when we read something that's well written, it holds our attention. We're intrigued by cleverly turned phrases and metaphors that paint visual images we can't forget.

At Veritas, the entire English curriculum is designed to teach your child to become one of those great writers. That's not to say that everyone is equally gifted. Rather, our goal is to develop a child's gifts fully.

The grammar of language is about language structure, how the words contribute to a sentence. Why do poorly written sentences and bad grammar even matter? The rules of language—like any other rules exist to systematize and prescribe what the speakers of that language agree to be correct and effective communication. Students who ignore or never learn what is considered proper English will be at a distinct disadvantage in their education and in life.

Grammar as a subject has been taught for a long time. The first grammar text, written in 1586, was based on William Lily's Latin grammar text. In the United States the first English grammar text was published in 1765. Up until the last generation, teaching English grammar was considered to be as crucial as teaching reading.

Our search for best-in-class grammar curricula led us to Shurley English. We knew we wanted easy memorization, not logical deduction, to be the prima-

ry learning method. Through fun chanting, children in the grammar stage are taught the parts of speech and what makes a complete sentence. Imagine a sixyear-old who can identify nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, and prepositional phrases in sentences. This seems amazing to our modern sensibilities, but this was once the norm. Once children can identify parts of speech through a learned pattern, they are better equipped to write their own sentences, paragraphs, and stories.

To teach writing classically, we wanted a program that modeled other writing as a key teaching technique. In the past, children were taught to write by modeling the masters. Over 20 years ago, we found the Institute for Excellence in Writing (IEW). This program follows patterns of composition similar to those taught in the classical exercises called the progymnasmata. Using this method, children learn by imitation, just like in ancient Greece and Rome.

An alternative track we offer in grammar school uses the Writing and Rhetoric and Well-Ordered Language books from Classical Academic Press (CAP). This track starts in third grade and has proven beneficial for those students not reading as well in first grade. Children will engage with the English language in a way that captures the imagination and is sure to make them want to become masters of their own language.

With enough practice, students will be ready to take the training wheels off. Students are now developing their own writing. The composition program we use was developed by us in partnership with the staff at WORLD Magazine. WORLD is known for their excellent writing staff. Too many times what children learn is only theoretical in nature. We are pleased that through our composition curriculum your children can learn from and be inspired by those who actually write for a living. Students will learn many different styles of writing in Composition I and II. Further interest in writing can be further fostered through several electives offered as live online courses.

Some students may need more work before starting a composition course. If your seventh grader is not ready to go into Composition I, we offer a transition course that will allow the student to get caught up.

The Veritas Approach to History

A history program was how Veritas began. After reading *Recovering the Lost Tools of Learning*, our interest in classical education from a Christian worldview was piqued. While building a classical school and looking for curriculum, we realized the value of teaching young children a comprehensive timeline of history. We wanted to connect it to learning the content of the Bible, as well. (Learn more about that at the Bible Course Options pages.)

Children in second grade are ready to start learning a timeline. Before that, some groundwork should be done. In Kindergarten, family histories and holidays can orient children to the basics of a timeline. In first grade, students are taught a simplified version of American history to take advantage of their growing understanding of place and time.

Beginning in second grade, students are ready for a formal study of history. We begin in the beginning, from creation. Each year from grades 2–6, students will study 32 events. In those five years, they'll have learned 160 events. Our approach has students regularly reviewing what they've learned, too. This works remarkably well because, as classical educators point out, it's how they are wired. At this time in their development, they love learning through memorization.

The five-year history cycle is described in the chart below: After five years, students know dates and crucial facts about 160 events. Some programs

fail to teach more than key events' dates. Students may learn that the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD 79 buried Pompeii. Without more details, though, they may not realize its connection to the New Testament. Similarly, students may learn that World War I raged from 1914 to 1918 and World War II from 1939 to 1945. Without more details, students will miss learning basic differences of how the wars were fought (their aircraft and weapons, for example). Missing those kinds of details, students won't see how the wars' key features fit into a larger historical context. Laurie and I will never forget visiting the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum when

our oldest son was 12. He quickly recognized which aircraft belonged to which war.

While ideal to start at the beginning, it's not necessary. In a homeschool with two or more children, you might consider teaching everyone at the same level. Integrated learning for art projects, field trips, etc. can be more effective this way. If younger children start after the first year, they can simply circle back to the beginning later. Children who have less than five years to complete the cycle can complete it in a condensed form. They can move through more than one series per year. They spend less time learning details, but they commit the core timeline to memory. We also have an option, called History Transition that condenses all five years into one.

Our approach to history in grammar school has served many students well. Maybe that's why it's one of the most awarded programs around.





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The Veritas Approach to Latin

Latin's a dead language. Almost. Latin is spoken only in the Vatican. So, it's only almost dead. A dead language is "one that is no longer the native language of any community." Since we don't learn Latin primarily to speak it, some wonder why we should learn it at all.

We're occasionally asked, "Why Latin? Why not Spanish or French? At least we'd have our children learning a language that would be useful." And it would be—especially if they live in Miami or Montreal.

Don't be fooled. The reasons children should learn Latin are not the same reasons they should learn a modern foreign language. And they shouldn't learn Latin in the same way they learn modern foreign languages.

When learning a modern foreign language, you will almost always use what is called BICS (Basic

Interpersonal Communicative Skills). This sort of learning focuses on the language skills needed to get along with others. Learning to speak Italian will allow you to travel to Italy quite enjoyably. While there, you'll better understand local television. You might even negotiate more savings on the beautiful leather boots you want to bring home. BICS helps us learn to communicate in another language.

On the other hand, CALP (Cognitive Academic Language Proficiency), will build our understanding of the language itself. The logic and power of the language will be learned. Word order, inflection, semantic structures, and grammar are all included. We are convinced classical languages in general, and Latin in particular, must be learned this way to secure the real benefit of studying them.

The renewed interest in classical education has necessarily brought a renewed interest in learning Latin. Sometimes a vocal minority of the more academic types can be heard expressing lofty, even esoteric ideas. One idea we've heard is that the most important reason to learn Latin is to read ancient works in the language in which they've been written. We don't mind the thought, but few students will ever realize this reason for learning Latin. That level of mastery eludes the majority of today's classically educated students. It's a little like saying you shouldn't learn to play golf unless you intend to play the PGA Tour.

At Veritas we're a bit more practical. Here's our list, presented from greatest to least importance, for why your children should learn Latin.

- Latin is a tool of leverage for mastering English, its vocabulary, its grammar, even its idioms, and expressions.
- Latin will help students get closer to some of the most transformative ideas ever written.
- Learning of other subjects will be accelerated.
- Learning modern foreign languages will be much more efficient.
- Learning the language of science, medicine, and related fields will be simplified.

MASTERING ENGLISH

During the formative years of 3rd–6th grades, Latin students will develop their vocabulary faster, master English grammar more easily and build a storehouse of idioms and expressions to enhance their understanding of great literature and join the Great Conversation through the Great Books in later years. It is the reason they will quickly move their reading (and writing) abilities well beyond their peers. Students of Latin typically excel on standardized tests, especially English vocabulary. Most of English vocabulary is derived from Latin. Latin grammar is also ideal for learning the way all languages, including English, work.

Get closer to some of the most transformative ideas ever written – Consider how much the ancient Israelites, Greeks, and Romans have shaped our world. Their ideas—uttered in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin—built Western civilization. Some people study

these classical languages to get closer to those original ideas. That's why seminarians study the original languages of the Bible. Translations of extraordinary ideas can powerfully transform. How much more when understood in the language they were spoken!

Acceleration of all learning - This goes beyond reading and writing abilities. Dorothy Sayers says it quite well in The Lost Tools of Learning: "I will say at once, quite firmly, that the best grounding for education is the Latin grammar. I say this, not because Latin is traditional and medieval, but simply because even a rudimentary knowledge of Latin cuts down the labor and pains of learning almost any other subject by at least fifty percent." It does this by honing skills of observation, memory, and comparison.

Learning modern foreign languages - Knowing Latin aids learning other languages, especially the romance languages; Spanish, French, Italian, Portuguese, and Romanian. The overwhelming majority of the words in these languages derived from Latin, and their grammatical structure is similar to Latin as well

Learning the language of science, medicine, and related fields. - Theology, law, medicine, science, and philosophy use many Latin words or English words derived from Latin. A large portion of the root words for most of the modern sciences come from Latin.

The list is practical and straightforward. The first reason is so important that it's the one thing I would tell a non-classical Christian school to add to the curriculum or tell any parent to include in their child's education. Here's evidence from a paper written by Nancy Mavrogenes that appeared in the academic journal Phi Delta Kappan in 1979 about a study in Iowa:

"In 1971, more than 4,000 fourth-, fifth- and sixth-grade pupils of all backgrounds and abilities received 15 to 20 minutes of daily Latin instruction. The performance of the fifth-grade Latin pupils on the vocabulary test of the Iowa Test of Basic Skills was one full year higher than the performance of control pupils who had not studied Latin. Both the Latin group and the control group had been matched for similar backgrounds and abilities."

Consider Facebook founder, Mark Zuckerberg. You probably know he attended Harvard, briefly. For high school, he attended Phillips Exeter Academy. On his Harvard application, he listed Latin as one of the languages he studied. He once quoted lines from the Aeneid in a public talk and now regards Latin as one of the keys to his success.

We could have listed more than a dozen reasons for studying Latin. It seemed best to keep the list short and to the point. Whether you agree with the list or not, it's hard to disagree that the study of Latin is vital.

The Veritas Approach to Foreign Languages

The old joke asks, "What do you call someone who speaks three languages?" *Trilingual*. "Someone who speaks two?" *Bilingual*. "And what do you call someone who speaks only one?" *American*.

The joke works because it pokes fun at a deficiency in American education. Many believe there's no use, no benefit, to learning more languages than one—English. Veritas aims to dispel that notion and retire the crack's humor. Those who receive a Veritas education will never be the butt of that joke.

Students study a modern foreign language (MFL) for different reasons.

Some want to understand the people and customs of the foreign place where they live. Missionaries to Tanzania may want their children to learn Swahili. A family stationed in Okinawa believes they'll fit in better if they learn a little Japanese.

Others learn an MFL to befriend and do business with those who don't speak their language. America is a melting pot of peoples. One way of welcoming an Ethiopian immigrant is to pick up a few Amharic phrases. Learning some Vietnamese may win a smile from the restaurateur where you eat lunch.

Still others want to learn an MFL to sharpen their mind and improve brain function. All foreign languages have sounds ours don't. Most use a writing system ours doesn't, either. Learning a different language calls for attention, memorization, analysis, and creativity. It gives the mind a workout.

Some want to expose themselves to ideas as first expressed in another language. A literature student wants to experience the Spanish of Cervantes. A philosophy student wants to read Pascal in the original French. A physics student wants to tackle the German of Einstein's thought.

And colleges want to see at least two years of the same MFL on a transcript.

All these reasons are valid; all have their place.

The world's home to about 7,000 languages. Like any education that teaches modern foreign languages, Veritas has to be selective. We currently offer courses in four key languages: Spanish, French, German, and Mandarin.

Each has a rich history. Each will be useful for years to come. German, French, and Spanish are "founding languages" of the modern West. Mandarin hails from China, and about a billion call it their native tongue.

Regardless of why someone learns an MFL, doing so enriches both the student and the world. Learning another people's language is learning something about them. And learning about them can lead to better communication and greater understanding.

We recommend students study MFLs after they've had Latin and, hopefully, some Greek. Consequently, most Veritas students are taking MFLs in their high school years.

Veritas wants to equip students to exchange ideas with others. When we can communicate in another's language, we've removed a barrier to understanding. If we can do that, we may be able to make the world a little more peaceful place. And that aim is nothing to laugh at.

The Veritas Approach to Linguistics

At Veritas, Linguistics includes learning spelling and word roots. It includes an unexpected observation, too, which is this. The ability to spell probably more than any other academic skill—is a gift from God. Some have it; some don't. That doesn't mean we shouldn't teach it. It means only that we should have realistic expectations.

In the 1980s, it was popular to have children memorize the "look" of whole words rather than learn spelling rules. Classical educators know this makes no sense. English isn't like Chinese, which doesn't have an alphabet. Chinese uses a logographic system of symbols to represent words. Memorization is the only option.

The grammar stage provides the opportunity for children to learn tools of learning, including spelling rules. Learning spelling rules proves important for mastery of the English language. Remember "I before E, except after C"?

Students learning English should start with a phonics program like The Phonics Museum. The Phonics Museum introduces basic spelling rules. Upon completion—typically at the end of first grade—students are ready to learn more advanced spelling rules. To help students master these rules, The Phonetic Zoo provides three exceptional years that fit well anywhere between second and fifth grades. In the grammar stage, children learn well through repetition. In The Phonetic Zoo, students study the same rules for three years, but they encounter words of increasing difficulty. The curriculum's multisensory approach allows children to hear, see, and feel (write) the rules.

Each lesson presents a rule, jingle or hint, and 15 words that either follow the rule or break it. Flashcards with animals and animal names can be used for visual reinforcement. Every fifth lesson is a personalized spelling test using words from the student's own writing or vocabulary. Students learn independently. They listen to (and practice) a ten-minute lesson each day. They practice again and again until a perfect score is achieved. With the repetition of auditory input,

this classical approach is the best way for most children to learn spelling rules and vocabulary.

In sixth grade, students move on to study word origins using *Vocabulary from Classical Roots.* Students learn to unlock the meaning of words by looking at their Greek and Latin roots. This word-root approach to vocabulary development prepares students to read impressive works. It equips them to master far more word meanings than what's typical for their grade level. As with spelling, why ask students simply to memorize word meanings? Better to give them tools to ascertain word meanings by their roots.

The Veritas Approach to Logic

Dorothy Sayers, the famed mystery writer and proponent of classical education, described middle-schoolers as "pert." Pert is a euphemism for argumentative and cheeky. Most who've had the pleasure of teaching a middle-schooler know what Sayers meant.

One common response to young teens' cantankerousness is to clamp down. Don't let them argue with you. Silence them before a disagreement turns into a shouting match. If possible, keep them seen but not heard.

Another common approach is to hand these young adults a blank check. Let them say what they want without challenge. Don't question their opinions. Don't question their attitudes. Permit them to express themselves, however that expression comes out.

Veritas doesn't find either approach satisfying or right.

A better solution is what Sayers suggested. Teach these young adults how to argue well. Give them the tools they need to reason with aplomb. Some see this approach as proffering water pistols to pranksters. You'll get wet, yes, but it'll be worth it. You'll be helping children become adults. You'll be equipping them to know what they believe and to defend it. You'll be preparing them to stand on their own two feet.

Let's teach them to argue well by teaching them logic. Let's show them the importance of making their case. Let's show them that a proper "argument" is one that produces more light than heat.

In a study of logic, students learn about claims and evidence. They learn about claims that must be true, claims that may be, and claims that can't be. They learn ancient takes on the topic, and they hear from modern perspectives, as well. They learn about the power and usefulness of logic, and they learn about its limitations.

Parents and teachers who take this approach have a common but unexpected experience. They realize that their own use of logic needs shoring up. They come to this realization because their students take them there.

Mom and Dad want to have a conversation with their young-adult children. They make some claim about God, the world, or how things ought to be. What surprises them are the words that fall out of their children's mouths in response. "That was an ad verecundiam fallacy, Dad. The authority you cited isn't an authority on the topic at all."

Dad gets wet, but he doesn't get soaked. It's good to teach teens how to argue well. It's crucial to teach them how to do it with civility and charity.

Veritas sees training in logic as a tool, not a weapon. It shouldn't be used to trounce an opponent. It shouldn't be used to mask one's own weaknesses. Logic is a set of skills and mental habits that should serve both truth and others.

There are two types of logic that students study: formal and informal. Formal logic is the abstract study of propositions, statements, and deductive arguments. It uses symbolic notation to express such structures and to test the validity of arguments. Informal logic is the study of logical fallacies in natural language.

Training middle-schoolers to argue well seems counterintuitive to some. Still, the best way to prepare youth for the adult road ahead is to help them pack what they'll need. They'll need to think clearly, reason soundly, and speak kindly. Teaching middle-schoolers how to argue may be counterintuitive, but it's logical. It's the next step toward their maturity.







In the grammar years, math provides content for developing memorization tools. In the dialectic years, subjects like Algebra I and Geometry develop students' reasoning skills. In the rhetoric years, Pre-calculus, Calculus, Statistics, and Business Math lead students to value math in real-world applications.

At Veritas, we're convinced that math has been dumbed down in America.¹ Most students are more capable than we think. Our mission is to help make sure your children don't become a dismal math statistic. For more than 25 years, we've been proving that our math standards shouldn't come from what we were raised with. After all, if the education we ourselves received was as education should be, why would we be doing something different for our children? A study of historical² and international math standards helps us see this clearly.

Maybe the best way to understand our approach is to mark some milestones.

Veritas recommends Saxon Math for K-6th. We also recommend Math-U-See—especially for students who struggle with learning abstract concepts. We then recommend Jacobs for Algebra I and Geometry, Foerster for Algebra II and Pre-Calculus, and Larson for Calculus.³

Saxon, with its incremental advances and continual review, works best with the grammar stage. Thankfully, Harold Jacobs understands the dialectic student and has written a superb curriculum for them with Algebra I and Geometry. One of his former students, Paul Foerster, writes where Jacobs left off, providing us our favorite texts for Algebra II and Pre-Calculus. Finally, Larson, a most prolific producer of Calculus texts, provides the capstone to our math curriculum. Some prefer to stick with Saxon into the secondary school years. We are fine with that—even offering live class options using Saxon—but prefer texts written with more of a classical pedagogical approach.

Math-U-See is also used in the secondary. Again, its greatest beneficiaries are students who struggle with abstract concepts.

Today, all math education needs to address the use of technology. At Veritas, it's simple: use technology as a tool, not a crutch. Learning to work a two-variable algebraic equation is important. When mastered, however, why waste time plugging and chugging the numbers to develop a graphing solution? Let a machine do the number crunching. Students simply need to know how to do it.

The Veritas Approach to Memory Period

If you have heard anything about the resurgence of classical education, you've likely heard of Dorothy Sayers. In 1947 she delivered an address at Oxford University called "The Lost Tools of Learning." She lamented the state of education for children. She went on to describe the trivium and the opportunity following it provided in modern education. The trivium is defined with three stages: grammar, dialectic, and rhetoric. In the grammar stage—akin to the grammar school years—she says this:

... anything and everything which can be usefully committed to memory should be memorized at this period, whether it is immediately intelligible or not. The modern tendency is to try and force rational explanations on a child's mind at too early an age. Intelligent questions, spontaneously asked, should, of course, receive an immediate and rational answer; but it is a great mistake to suppose that a child cannot readily enjoy and remember things that are beyond his power to analyze—particularly if those things have a strong imaginative appeal (as, for example, "Kubla Kahn"), an attractive jingle (like some of the memory-rhymes for Latin genders), or an abundance of rich, resounding polysyllables (like the Quicunque vult).

She was so right. As adults, we tend to think of teaching young children as if they are little adults who learn like adults. They're not. Think back to your childhood. How many nursery rhymes do you remember? Watch young children sing and chant the same thing over and over again. They love to learn in ways we no longer do.

The beauty is you still remember those songs as an adult. There is a reason. That is when the brain is set to have lots of information put in it. It works a bit like filling a hard drive for later use.

For years we've known this is an opportunity to be captured. There are lots of things we want children

to memorize in those grammar school years. We also realized how hard it is to recite all the chants and songs throughout the school day for each subject.

Years ago on a school visit, we had the opportunity to observe students reciting seemingly endless amounts of material that they had memorized. We were struck with the fact that this is a crucial, if not the key, ingredient to the grammar stage of classical Christian education. We learned that these students simply spent a small amount of time each day going through a long list of things to commit to memory. It is amazing what can be memorized dedicating a few minutes every day. That's how Memory Period was born.

Students will learn a timeline of history and the Bible, geography facts, Latin declensions, math facts, grammar jingles, and more.

Taking it one step further by marching, shouting, and generally letting kids be kids has made the learning even more fun. Children love it.

The Veritas Approach to Omnibus

Teaching children to think biblically about everything is one of the hardest jobs parents and teachers have. Learning from the past to live in the present might be second hardest. By tapping some of the greatest thinkers alive, Veritas produced the Omnibus, a Great Books curriculum for grades 7–12 that grounds students in their faith. Omnibus is a Latin term meaning "all-encompassing." Each year of the Omnibus curriculum combines history, theology, and literature to help students grow in their appreciation of the unity of all knowledge.

The Omnibus includes six years with two simultaneous courses per year. The Primary books course focuses closely on primary-source historical works and events from the time period covered. The Secondary course offers balance and a lighter workload, with a greater focus on literature and theology. Taken together, students will earn three credits: one each in history, theology, and literature. For example: As part of Omnibus I Primary, students delve into the works of Plato, dealing with the Socratic Method. In Omnibus I Secondary, some reading includes modern works by Peter Kreeft, presenting fictional conversations between Socrates, abortionists, and university professors. This integrated, classical approach equips students with both an in-depth knowledge of history and the Great Books, while training them in the skills needed to process and articulate the meaning of this knowledge through the prism of a Christian worldview. Students completing all six years of Omnibus Primary and Secondary courses will have the added benefit of the in-depth study of all 66 books of the Bible.

When first learning about the Omnibus some are concerned with difficulty and enjoyability. We take particular care to fit the stage of the learner. The readings for the Omnibus can seem overwhelming. Students should be encouraged to learn to skim some sections—Herodotus's *Histories* is an example—and to enjoy the richness of others—Homer's *Odyssey*, for example. Class types and exercises are varied enough to capture all imaginations.


Omnibus covers the ancient, medieval, and modern time periods, cycling through them twice.

The chart shows the transcript names we recommend if a student takes both the Primary and Secondary courses in a 12-month period. Taking two courses yields three credits.

Many ask, "Can we do only a year or a few years, or only primary, or only secondary courses?" Our answer is the same: Any study of the Great Books to learn to think biblically about everything will be of great value.

Whether you plan to do all twelve classes over six years or only one, students will benefit for the rest of their lives by joining the "Great Conversation." Learning can happen in all three formats: You Teach, Self-Paced, and Live Online.

The Veritas Approach to Reading

Learning to read is foundational, and it may be the most important educational skill a child will ever learn. How children learn to read will set a trajectory for life. Many adults attribute much of their success and enjoyment in life to their reading. It is important



to inculcate not just skill at reading but also the love of reading. At Veritas we believe that a phonetic approach is the way a child should be taught to read. The process should also be fun. We want to capture children's imaginations and enjoyment.

English is not like Chinese, where a child needs to learn a character for every word. Instead,

English allows children to recognize and associate sounds of letters in the alphabet. They can decode or sound out words. Once a child masters letter sounds and sounds of blends they will be able to sound out any word they encounter.

ant. Some programs that teach reading phonetically require that children apply analytical skills as they learn to read. Linguists may enjoy such study, but not children. They want to read and want to do so as quickly as they can. Children this age are not developmentally ready to analyze. We believe that learning to read should be fun and efficient. It should cause children to ask for more. Books should become some of their best friends.

The Veritas Approach to Rhetoric

Rhetoric is the art of effective, persuasive, winsome communication. It often gets a bad rap, though. Listen to today's social, cultural, or political commentary. You'll soon hear claims that someone's spouting "empty rhetoric."

Many see rhetoric as showy words without substance. A speaker sounds great. Her facts don't hold up, though, and her reasoning is flawed. Her ideas are great, but they don't seem to square with reality. She seems sincere, but we're not sure she's sure of what she's saying.

Worse, some view rhetoric as a tool of manipulation. The speaker seems to be keeping something from us. Is he telling us the whole truth? What does he hope to get out of persuading us? Will he gain something valuable at our expense? Does he have our best interest in mind?

People's concerns about much of today's rhetoric are legitimate. Rhetoric has suffered much abuse and neglect. Some speak and write with great form, but their message has little substance. Some will say or do whatever they need to get our "like," our dollar, or our vote.

Classical educators value rhetoric and want to see it restored. As the third phase of the Trivium, it provides a key, even capstone role for a K-12 education. Rhetoric doesn't have to be a tool to simply get what we want. It needn't be showy or manipulative. It needn't be empty, either. Instead, rhetoric can be skillful, straightforward communication. It can be informative and even inspiring. It can be honest and kind, genuine, and empathetic.

This is how Veritas sees rhetoric. This is what the art of persuasion should be. Veritas rhetoric equips students to have something worthwhile to say and to say it well.

Our approach to rhetoric values much of what Greeks and Romans said about the subject. We still sit at their feet to hear great insights. We still aim to put their best ideas into practice.

Greeks and Romans taught us how to come up with something to say. They taught us how to order our thoughts and order our words. They taught us, too, how to shape a message to an audience. They didn't teach us much about using rhetoric to love and serve others, though.

The Veritas approach to rhetoric does. It turns to the Bible and the Christian tradition for guidance. It seeks to follow and teach the powerful example of Jesus's words and deeds. We show high school students a better way to persuade.

How ought Christ's followers to try to persuade others? How should their rhetorical efforts look different from those of the world around? How can they seek to persuade with empathy, understanding, compassion? How can they both speak to others and listen to them? Practically speaking, we recommend two years of Rhetoric, ideally in the sophomore and junior years. In Rhetoric I students learn much about rhetoric (80% of the course) and practice developing their rhetorical skills (20%). Rhetoric II flips the objectives, with 80% of the course dedicated to developing students' rhetorical skills and 20% to learning more about rhetoric.

Jesus called us all to love our neighbor as ourself. A Veritas approach to rhetoric asks how we can do that in our speaking and writing and living. A Veritas rhetoric equips students to adorn truthful words with beauty.

SENIOR THESIS

The senior thesis is the jewel in upper-school students' crown. Students focus their studies and curiosities on a culminating project. The project spotlights what they've learned from their classical education. It gives them an opportunity to contribute to it, as well.

The senior thesis is the culmination of a student's training in rhetoric. The purpose of the project is to stake out a position on an arguable topic and defend it. The thesis includes written and oral components, as well as research and reflection.

The thesis project requires students to express ideas clearly. It demands that they substantiate their claims and answer challenges. The senior thesis equips students to tackle tough topics and make sense of them. It equips students to share a big idea their idea—with power and persuasiveness.



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

The Veritas Approach to Science

"I'm not a science person." If science teachers banked a dollar every time they heard it, they could retire after five years. Many students feel they lack the gene or the gift or whatever it takes to succeed in science. They've bought the piece of fiction that science isn't for everyone.

"Science involves a lot of math," they reason, "and I'm not a math person." "Science isn't important for what I want to do in life." "Science is incompatible with my faith." "Science isn't for the imaginative, the verbal, or women, and I'm all three." Each sentiment may be understandable. Each reveals an incomplete or inaccurate picture of what science is, though.

Veritas has a different view of science. We see it as the cultivation of a skillful inquisitiveness about the natural world. We see it as applying to all of us, as well. We believe that science, as a field of study, primarily involves discovering the timeless, universal principles God has built into His creation. Therefore, we teach students not only the facts and principles already discovered by past generations, but also the carefully executed processes that have made these facts and principles known. We also seek to cultivate and encourage an attitude of wonder and curiosity. Science is a means of delving into Almighty God's handiwork, and it should naturally inspire us all. Aristotle said that human nature compels us all to want to know about ourselves and the world around us. Part of what makes us different from dogs, fish, and flowers is our appetite for answers. Why does the sky look blue but space black? Where did the dinosaurs go? Why are there no pain receptors in the brain? Why are there so many languages in the world? Why aren't there more chocolate chips in this cookie?

We can no more opt out of our inclination to learn new things than we can choose never again to breathe, sleep, or dream. Desiring to know doesn't so much describe what we do as who we are. Our curiosity percolates from the core of our being.

By nature, we explore, observe, theorize, hypothesize, test, and revise. We go for curiosity's sake where we've never gone before. We note, describe, and measure what we see, hear, touch, taste, and smell. We build mental models to explain our experiences. We later replace those models when better ones come. When we're doing all these things, we're doing science.

Veritas believes that everyone is a science person. Some prefer art and music to biology, chemistry, and physics, true. Others enjoy the life and physical sciences and do well in them with little effort. This is true, also. No two of us have identical strengths and skills. Still, God has fashioned each of us to be a science person.

The sciences can enliven the mind as much as any humanities course. They can describe, model, and pre-

dict natural phenomena. They can open our eyes to see the world in new ways. They can help us solve some of mankind's most troublesome problems.

Veritas introduces students to science's contributions found in the Great Books, too. We teach not only science proper, but also scientific reasoning. We explore ideas that lead us to ask important questions about ourselves and the world.

We use three different curricula in our science courses. Veritas is working on a science curriculum. The first volume is Chemistry and is what we use in our live online courses. Apologia is a very homeschool friendly and covers the basics of the sciences. Novare Science is a more rigorous mastery approach. The difference being Novare covers fewer topics but goes in-depth into those that are covered. We believe either of these approaches provide a solid foundation for the classically educated student.

It's notable that Veritas does not recommend science in grammar school. As you should see, not because we think science unimportant. Rather, we know time is limited, and building the language and math foundation is more important. And we've seen it time and time again because we've produced some great scientists. Students with no grammar school science may start a bit behind their peers who've had science, but very quickly pass them in their science learning. Of course, Veritas recommends and includes memorizing a whole host of science facts in Memory Period of grammar school.

Some believe the sciences have little to offer a classical Christian education. Veritas aims to dispel that notion. We humans are a curious lot at heart, brimming with questions. Science can't answer them all, but it can give us powerful tools for seeking those answers out.



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
